What is exchanged in a QSO



- Callsigns (obvious really)
 - ▶ But don't forget the /P /A etc.... You will lose points if you do.
- Signal Reports
 - Quite often 5 and 9 even if not (it's easier)
 - VHF/UHF many reports are real though 5 and 3
 - ▶ No real rules around it but log the wrong report and lose points
- Sequence Number
 - ▶ What number you are at, 1st QSO is 1, etc.
- Locator
 - ► E.g. 1092PA
 - The first 4 you gain bonus points for each one worked, so worth targeting ones you know you can reach but haven't worked yet.

Typical QSO

Calling Station

- 1. First check frequency is not in use
- CQ Contest CQ Contest <callsign> - etc
- 3. <responders callsign> You are
 <report> Number <x> <Locator>
- 4. Confirm (QSL/Roger) / 73 / QRZ



Responding Station

- 1. Find station calling CQ contest turn beam if necessary/available
- 2. State own callsign see if they respond
- 3. Confirm (QSL) You are <report>
 Number <x> <Locator>
- 4. Give 73 if caller not QRZ already.



What can possibly go wrong?

- Weak signal you cannot make callsign/report/locator
 - Make the effort to try again nobody minds repeating
 - "My Report again please" "My Locator again please"
 - If not 100% confirm what you did year
 - "You gave me 5/7 Number 62 from IO81MX roger?"
 - Try different phonetics sometimes easier in QSB etc.
 - Mike -> Mexico Zulu -> Zanzibar Papa Alpha -> Pacific Atlantic
- ▶ QRM
 - Local stations saturating your receiver
 - Try beaming off may still work your station but less QRM
 - Memorise call/freq and come back later QRM may have moved
- Pileup
 - You cannot get heard above other stations
 - Don't keep trying... come back to them later
- Worked Before
 - "We have already worked Old Man"
 - ▶ Check your log it may be their mistake
 - Nobody minds, we've all done it. Don't let if phase you.



Etiquette

- Quick Succession contesters. Don't waste time
 - Very abrupt, as soon as got your report, QSL, QRZ...
 - ▶ They just want that big score at the end of the contest
- Pleasure Contesters
 - "Hello Tim, Good to work you again"
 - "Smashing signal, 73 and good luck in the contest"
- Everyone is polite even the rapid fire stations
 - Nobody minds repeating/confirming we all want the points
- Know which you are working and respond accordingly




Logging - Benefits of software logging

MKARS

- Tracks Sequence numbers for you, 001 002 003
- Warns if you've worked before
- Partial match callsign or locator (if you're struggling to hear)
- Can tell you where they are (so can turn beam)
- Memories for saving and coming back later (pileups etc.)
- Grid map (easily view squares not worked)
- Very easy to submit results at end of the contest

Minos Logging

- Save Station/Location defaults
 - ► Equipment, Location details
- Access RSGB Schedule of contests
- Submitting results easy.





Quick to add new entry

Tells if you have worked before in same contest.

Checks against history file


- Known contesters
- Callsigns
- Locators

Calculates bearings and distance

Memories to stations to 'try later'.

Rig and Rotator control for full automation.

How to enter a VHF contest

So, you've decided to have a go in an RSGB VHF Contest - below is a brief guide to the different ways you can submit your entry. Or you can go straight to the following links:

Upload your log: upload

Enter your paper log: enter


View submitted logs to check that your entry has been received received

Either upload export file from Minos or transcribe paper log online



Now enter the file name(s) containing your entry If you have a single file that contains all the cover sheet information (e.g. REG1TEST or Cabrillo) then **only upload the one file.** If you have separate log file and cover sheet file then upload both files. Then click on the "NEXT" button

Entry deadline for the 10 Apr 432MHz UKAC is Tue 17-Apr-2018 23:59 UTC

Getting Results

- Email confirmation after Adjudication
 - ► Incorrect callsigns (no /P), sequence, locators etc.
 - Update your 'Archive List' for corrections to callsigns/locators
- Adjust station / procedure for improvements
 - Different antenna
 - Different location
 - Different radio
 - Different Mic / Compression settings
 - Better coax
 - Better technique
 - ► Hunting or Hunted or both & ratio
- Arrange test schedules online with other contesters
 - Facebook group UK VHF/UHF contesting



/P Operation



Home QTH not suitable?

- High Noise
- Poor Elevation

Operate mobile/portable

- Remote location good elevation low noise
- Must stay @ location for duration of contest
- Make sure you give /P callsign!
- Get land-owners permission
- Safety First
 - Public safety injury to others
 - Own safety overhead cables etc.



Come out /P one evening - Invitation

- 'Top Farm' Lidlington IO92RA
 - 52.03581, -0.56060
 - Boughton End Lane off A507 (J13 to Ampthill)
- Tuesday or Thursday evening from 7pm
 - Check contest dates on club diary
- Great take off point
 - 434ft ASL good but not Dunstable Downs
 - 360 degree unobstructed views

MKARS has land owner permission to operate from this prime location. Gated access (we have the lock code). Max of 3 vehicles allowed. No tents/structures but portable mast ok.
